Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing on behalf of myself, and Mary Higgins, Chair of Governors of Barnwood Park School to inform you of forthcoming changes to our school uniform. Firstly however, I would like to express my gratitude to the entire school community for the exceptionally warm welcome I have received. Myself and the wider team are committed to making Barnwood Park School outstanding in every way.

The forthcoming changes to our school uniform will be effective from 1st September 2024 but I felt it was important to provide you with advance notice of these changes to avoid any unnecessary purchases, especially considering the current cost of living pressures.

## **Rationale for Uniform Adjustments:**

- 1. **Preparation for Later Life:** Smart uniforms help prepare our students for their future professional lives.
- 2. **Consistency:** Ensuring a consistent uniform helps maintain equality among students.
- 3. School Pride: A unified appearance fosters a sense of pride and belonging among students.

## Elements of the Uniform That Will Remain Unchanged:

- Blazers
- Shirts
- Formal black shoes (no trainers)
- PE kit

## Changes to the Uniform:

- Trousers: Students will be allowed to wear <u>grey</u> trousers only. Currently, some students wear navy blue. Grey
  trousers are more accessible and cost-effective from major supermarkets and retailers, and I want to unify
  students so everyone is wearing the same.
- **Skirts:** I will be introducing a tartan kilt to replace the current skirt option. This will be similar to other Greenshaw Learning Trust schools. Following a consultation with students, the design will be finalised and this will be shared with you as soon as possible.
- **Ties:** I will be introducing a new tie for all students. Each student will wear the same navy and silver tie. Houses will be indicated using an alternative method, to be confirmed but this is likely to be a shield badge. Each student will be given their new tie, with no charge, either at the end of the Summer term or when we return in September. Parents will not need to purchase a tie.

**Support for Cost of Living:** I remain mindful of the financial impact these changes may have and am committed to supporting our families, therefore:

- A free kilt will be provided for all students, including new Year 6 students. Arrangements for the fitting and collection of these will be shared with you in due course.
